As the US Army Europe and Africa, Deputy Chief of Staff G6 Chief of Operations, Plans, and Exercises, Lieutenant Colonel (Retired) Roger Ordonez was responsible for numerous Information Technology (IT) projects and programs throughout the EUCOM and AFRICOM area of responsibility including interoperability with NATO Allies and other regional partners.

Lieutenant Colonel Ordonez served as Director of IT Operations at Headquarters U.S. Army Europe and Africa (USAREUR-AF) in Wiesbaden, Germany, where he led communications strategy and network capability integration across the European Command Area of Responsibility. As a key leader in the \$695M Enterprise Mission Information Technology Services (EMITS) contract, he coordinated strategic planning for Department of Defense Information Network – Army (DoDIN-A) and Mission Partner Environment (MPE) network, enhancing interoperability with NATO and coalition allies.

He directed the planning and resource execution for DEFENDER-Europe 2020, delivering \$10M in communications infrastructure 15% ahead of schedule and 20% under budget. His process improvements increased network service delivery by 8% and significantly optimized order execution and requirements capture across the theater.
